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

Cole breaks girls scoring record!



Congratulations to 2021 SEHS graduate **Tessa Cole** on becoming the leading scorer in Sherburne-Earlville girls basketball history this past winter!

An all-state guard in 2020, Tessa scored a game-high 22 points in a 56-44 home loss to Hamilton to give her 1,349 varsity points with two games to go. Tessa, who also had 10 rebounds and five steals in the March 13 game, passed **Lilly Berg** for the S-E girls scoring record with a foul shot in the third quarter.

Tessa went on to score 21 points against Onondaga and

20 more in the Marauders' season finale, a 71-40 win at New York Mills, as she extended her record to 1,390 varsity points.

Tessa, Lilly and Savannah Irwin are the only 1,000-point girls basketball scorers in S-E history. Lilly scored 1,341 points from 2011-2016, and Savannah amassed 1,141 during the same timeframe. ❖

Stoddard cruises to discus title!



Congratulations to Sherburne-Earlville sophomore Lily Stoddard for winning the girls discus championship during the Section 3 Class B-2 track and field meet June 8 at Holland Patent High School!

Lily set a personal record with her winning discus throw of 108 feet, 11 inches! Clinton junior Jenna Deep placed second at 97-7.

In a typical year, Lily would have qualified to compete athletes from all classifications in the state championships, which was canceled this past season because of COVID-19.

Lily also finished third at sectionals in the shot put (28-3). Deep took second (30-3.75) and Mount Markham senior Danae Wilson placed first (31-10.25). Great job, Lily! Keep up the outstanding work! ❖

SEHS shines at Art Show!




















World champion Odyssey team competes in Florida!

Congratulations once again to Sherburne-Earlville's Odyssey of the Mind Team, which won a virtual World Championship and placed second during in-person competition in Orlando, Florida, this past June!

The team of Jennifer Adsit, Lillie Ashton, Maleah Britton, Anna Fern, Lily French, Justiss Kovack and Peter Peschel also won its second straight Ranatra Fusca award at the World level under the direction of coach Heidi Johnson. This award is given to a team or individual for exceptional creativity in their problem's solution and is considered to be more difficult to achieve than earning a placement trophy.

S-E's Odyssey team also received State of New York Legislative Resolution certificates from Senator Peter Oberacker and Assemblyman John Lemondes at Marauder Stadium for winning a Virtual World Championship in May. Competing in Division 3 of the Virtual World Championships, SEHS placed first among 32 teams from around the world.

"Odyssey of the Mind has three components that are added together for a total score: Long-term Performance, Style, and Spontaneous," said Johnson, who coached most of the 2021 team for the past nine years. "While we did not receive the highest score in any one of the three individual areas, it



was our combined score that put us in first place. This makes for a true, well-rounded win!"

Teams qualified to compete in the Virtual World Championships through state or country competitions. Our SEHS team earned its spot by placing first in the New York Odyssey of the Mind competition in April.

"This is a long-sought dream come true," said Johnson, whose team took third in the state during its first year of competition and missed qualifying for Worlds by a mere 2.34 points. "They have worked hard at every level since that first year to earn the right to go to Worlds. I have struggled to find the words to express how very proud I am of this team and all that they have had to overcome to achieve this amazing honor."
