How do we finance a \$29 million project with no tax impact?

Capital projects are typically funded with state and local tax dollars. Our District's New York State building aid ratio is 96.7%.

Utilizing our Capital Reserve Fund, financing the project over 15 years, and other financial strategies results in the \$29 million capital project having no additional tax impact.

What's on the Ballot?

Shall the Board of Education undertake a project consisting of the reconstruction and renovation of, and the construction of improvements, additions and upgrades to various District buildings and facilities and the sites thereof, including conversion of the existing athletic field to a synthetic turf field and other athletic field and playfield improvements and additions, the purchase of original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus required in connection with the purposes for which such buildings, facilities and sites are used, all to include site, access, lighting, parking, demolition, utility, mechanical, plumbing and electrical improvements as well as payment of professional fees and all other necessary costs incidental to such work (the "Project") at a total maximum estimated cost of \$29,000,000 and to pay for the Project by (i) spending \$1,971,963 in surplus funds from the District's prior capital project approved by the District's voters in May of 2018, and (ii) by the levy of a tax which is hereby voted in the amount of \$27,028,037, subject to available State aid or to any other revenues available for such purpose, which tax shall be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education and in anticipation of the collection of such tax, bonds and notes of the District are hereby authorized to be issued at one time, or from time to time, in the principal amount not to exceed \$27,028,037, and a tax is hereby voted to pay the principal and interest on said obligations when due?

Voter Qualifications

- 1. Citizen of the United States.
- Resident of the district for a thirty-day period preceding the meeting at which desiring to vote.
- No person shall be deemed ineligible to vote by reason of age, race, or sex, who has the other qualifications required by this section.
- 4. Voters do not need to be registered. Non-registered voters may obtain absentee ballots through the District Office (see below).
- 5. Must be 18 years of age.
