

## **UPDATE: SCHOOL VACCINATIONS**

On June 13, 2019, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo signed legislation removing non-medical exemptions from school vaccination requirements for children.

The United States is experiencing the worst outbreak of measles in more than 25 years, with outbreaks in pockets of New York primarily driving the crisis. As a result of non-medical vaccination exemptions, many communities across New York have unacceptably low rates of vaccination. Those unvaccinated children can often attend school where they may spread the disease to other unvaccinated students, some of whom cannot receive vaccines due to medical conditions.

## **EPIPEN EXPIRATION UPDATE**

On June 5, 2019, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration announced an extension of expiration dates by four months of all lots of EpiPen 0.3 mg Auto-Injectors and its authorized generic version on the market in the U.S. This is based on a careful review of product stability data provided by Meridian. Our hope is that the expiration extension will help alleviate the EpiPen 0.3 mg strength shortage situation as Pfizer continues its efforts to increase production. Please review the table listed below to confirm the new expiration date for your school's supply of EpiPen or epinephrine injection 0.3 mg auto-injectors. #### CHILD FIND

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Sherburne-Earlville Central School District recognizes its responsibility to provide a free and appropriate public education to eligible students with disabilities within its geographical boundaries.

The District has a "child find" process that is designed to locate, identify and evaluate children with disabilities residing within its geographical boundaries from ages 3-21 (if a student has not already received a high school diploma). If you know a child who lives within the boundaries of the Sherburne-Earlville Central School District, attends a non-public or public school in the District and may be in the need of special education and/or related services, please contact the district's Director of Special Services for information regarding the referral and evaluation process.

If the student is a school-age student who attends a non-public private school outside the geographical boundaries of the District, the student may need to be referred to the school district in which the non-public school is located to receive services during the regular school year. Please contact that school district for information regarding time deadlines for requests for services.

The District's Child Find process extends to students with physical or mental impairments that substantially limit a major life activity. Such students may be eligible for services or accommodations pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Section 504 is a Federal civil rights statute that prohibits discrimination against persons with disabilities and programs receiving Federal financial assistance. ## **FERPA NOTIFICATION**

#### NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT

This section is intended to advise you of your rights with respect to the school records relating to (your son) (your daughter) (you) pursuant to the Federal "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974."

Parents of a student under 18, or a student 18 or older, have a right to inspect and review any and all official records, files, and data directly related to their children or themselves, including all material that is incorporated into each student's cumulative record folder, and intended for school use or to be available to parties outside the school or school system, and specifically including, but not necessarily limited to, identifying data, academic work completed, level of achievement (grades, standardized achievement test scores), attendance data, scores on standardized intelligence, aptitude, and psychological tests, interest inventory results, health data, family background information, teacher or counselor ratings and observations, and verified reports of serious or recurrent behavior patterns.

A parent of a student under age 18 or a student age 18 or older shall make a request for access to that student's school records, in writing, to the Superintendent of Schools, Guidance Counselor or Principal. Upon receipt of such request, arrangements shall be made to provide access to

such records within a reasonable period of time, but in any case, not more than forty-five (45) days after the request has been received.

Parents and students are also entitled to an opportunity for a hearing to challenge the content of such records, to insure that they are not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the privacy or other rights of students, and to provide an opportunity for the correction or deletion of any such inaccurate misleading, or inappropriate data contained therein. Any questions concerning the procedure to be followed in requesting such a hearing should be directed to the Superintendent.

Student records and any material contained therein that is personally identifiable are confidential and may not be released or made available to persons other than parents or students without the written consent of such parents or student. There are a number of exceptions to this rule, such as other school employees and officials, and certain state and federal officials, who have a legitimate educational need for access to such records in the course of their employment.

Students with disabilities shall have the option of deciding whether to disclose the existence of their disability on their high school transcripts.

## ANNUAL AHERA NOTIFICATION

In 1986, Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA). This required schools to be inspected to identify any asbestos-containing building materials. All Sherburne-Earlville School buildings were inspected and suspected materials were sampled to be tested and rated according to condition and potential hazard.

Every three years, Hillcrest is required to be re-inspected to determine if any known or suspected asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM) has changed and to make recommendations on managing or removing the ACBM.

The law further requires an asbestos-management plan be developed to monitor any known or suspected ACBM. The plan has several ongoing requirements: This notification letter announcing the availability of the management plans for anyone to review upon request, training

of the support staff about asbestos and how to deal with it, notifying short-term workers such as sub-contractors of the locations of any known or suspected ACBM, and posting of warning signs adjacent to locations of known or suspected ACBM. The designated asbestos coordinator conducts a six-month inspection of areas of the buildings where known or suspected ACBM are located to assure they remain in good condition.

It is the intention of the Sherburne-Earlville Central School District to comply with all federal and state regulations controlling asbestos and to take whatever steps are necessary to ensure students and employees a healthy and safe environment in which to learn and work.

#### DASA

#### **DIGNITY FOR ALL STUDENTS ACT**

The Dignity for All Students Act prohibits harassment and/or discrimination of students by employees or other students on school property or at school functions based upon a student's actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender or sex. Effective 7/1/13, DASA also prohibits cyberbullying (harassment or bullying by any form of electronic communication), including incidents that occur off-campus that may create a disruption in the school environment.

All matters of harassment will be taken very seriously. Reports of harassment will be dealt with in a timely manner. We will implement the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program, which fosters a climate of tolerance, civility, and acceptance. This program is designed to improve peer relations and make school a safer and more positive place for students to learn.

Students will be provided with character education and instruction in the safe and responsible use of the Internet and electronic devices. Interventions will be available for students who are bullied or harassed, as well as those who engage in these acts.

## WE'RE ACCEPTING WALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS!

The Sherburne-Earlville Central School District is accepting nominations for its Wall of Fame's Class of 2020 through January 20, 2020.

Our Wall of Fame is designed to honor S-E graduates and staff members who have made significant contributions to humanity, improved the quality of life, or achieved noteworthy recognition in their careers/education.

Graduates from the Class of 2015 or earlier and school personnel with at least five years of District service may be nominated this year. Nominees may be deceased. You may not nominate yourself.

The District's Selection Committee will honor a limited number of nominees in even-numbered years as Wall of Fame inductions alternate with Athletic Hall of Fame inductions (odd-numbered years). Wall of Fame nominees who are not selected in a given year will be re-considered in subsequent years. The Selection Committee and SECSD administration reserve the right to decide which nominees will be honored.

Anyone who submits a nomination must provide the following personal information: name, address, phone number and email address.

Nominations also must be dated and include the name, address, phone number and email address of the nominee, as well as the nominee's year of graduation or dates of employment in the District.

All nominations must be accompanied by a written description of the nominee's qualifications for Wall of Fame consideration.
